Uniform Dress Policy

- Statement of Policy:** All elementary, middle, and high schools in the Fairfield City School System shall implement a mandatory uniform policy for all students beginning in August 1996.
- Colors:** Black, Navy Blue, Khaki, and White (or Powder Blue for Grades 6-12)
- Shirts/Blouses:** Solid white or powder blue shirt/blouse with collar must be worn. White or powder blue turtlenecks or mock turtlenecks are allowed.
- Solid White shirt/blouse with school logo will be acceptable.
- Only solid white undershirts may be worn underneath shirts/blouses. **Shirts/blouses must be tucked in at all times.**
- Pants:** Black, navy blue, and khaki pants or knee shorts are to be worn. Girls may also wear skirts, jumpers, skorts, or capris, (skirt length – two (2) inches above the knee). **Pants must be worn on waistline at all times.** No sweatpants, denim, or jeans may be worn.
- Sweaters/Sweatshirt:** Solid black, solid navy blue, solid khaki, or solid white V-neck style, cardigan, and sweater-vest styles are permissible.
- Belts:** Black, Navy blue, Khaki, White or Brown. **BELTS MUST BE WORN WITH PANTS THAT HAVE BELT LOOPS.**
- Belt Buckles:** Belt buckles must be no larger than 2” by 3”, without any wording/symbols printed on the face of the buckle.
- Socks:** Socks must be worn. Girls may wear solid navy blue, white, or black tights or flesh tone hose. **(No design, seams, or fish-nets).**
- Shoes:** Solid black, navy blue, brown, or white shoes with the same color shoestrings as the shoe must be worn. A shoe is defined as an outer covering that encloses the entire foot (i.e. oxford, loafer, tennis shoes, heel and toe enclosed). Sandals and slip-ons are not allowed.

Book Bags: Only clear or mesh book bags can be used by students.

Student ID Badges: School distributed Student ID Badges must be worn.

The Principal or designee may consider certain attire which is disruptive the orderly educational process in the classroom or any similar grouping for instruction, as a Uniform Dress Policy violation. At the Principal's discretion, an "Out of Uniform Day" may be awarded to students for good behavior. Students new to the system have one week to adhere to the dress code. Failure to follow the dress code will be treated as a violation of the Code of Student Conduct.
